How are you making it happen?	Indigenous Diabetic Foot program designer, Jason Warnock (QLD) will be in Broome to conduct the workshop. We are able to do this through a grant from National Rural Health Alliance which will cover the costs of flying Jason to Broome, and also to purchase relevant resources that each participant will be able to take home with them. Fliers have been distributed to Broome and Derby based agencies including BRAMS, Germanus Kent, Broome Dialysis, Broome hospital, DAHS, but all interested agencies are invited to send participants
So...	With early stages of promotion, participant numbers are looking very encouraging.
How do you plan to get feedback?	We have developed an evaluation form that is to be distributed to the participating candidates. On the second day of the training, members of the public have been invited to be "mock" patients. They will also be encouraged to provide feedback on the ALO's "performance" via evaluation forms.
