Other duties include but are not limited to: collection and collation of data for reporting requirements; public speaking around ITC initiatives; promotion of the service to the indigenous community and other service providers. The ITC team works with patients, general practitioners, clinic/practice staff and a broad range of other relevant services to facilitate provision of appropriate multidisciplinary care for Aboriginal people with chronic disease. This includes providing proactive chronic disease education in a way that meets clients' individual needs and will result in improved health outcomes.

This role is for a fixed term until 30th June 2025 with the possibility of extension.


About You
